## GWYNEDD YOUNG CARERS CHARTER LAUNCH



As part of Carers Week celebrations 2011, Gwynedd Young Carers' Charter was launched on Monday 13th June by the Gwynedd Young Carers Project-Action for Children at Gwynedd Council headquarters.

Carers Week raises awareness of all carers who live across the U.K. The Charter, which will be available to young carers across Gwynedd, is an information service for young carers to help them to obtain information regarding their rights.

The Charter is part of Gwynedd Carers Partnership work program which highlights the rights of young carers and also provide support and advice for these young people. It is anticipated that the Charter will make a significant difference to their lives as carers.

The young carers who are part of the project have been busy drawing what Carers True Faces means to them.

There has been an exhibition of the young people's artwork at the headquarters of Gwynedd Council to celebrate the launch event and help the public understand what their needs are. The artwork will also be exhibiting at the Free Library in Dolgellau.

Glenys Campbell, Manager of the Gwynedd Young Carers Project- Action for Children, said: "We are delighted to have the opportunity to work with Gwynedd Council to provide a service that truly changes the lives of young carers. The Charter is a great addition to the service being provided by us and is key to enable young carers to cope with the emotional and physical pressures of caring for a parent or sibling. "

## Free technology hire service!

Mantell Gwynedd secured a sum of money via the youth service capital funding grant following a successful bid in 2008 which was co-ordinated by the Statutory Youth Service in Gwynedd.



These grants are offered in order to improve access to services and to purchase new mobile provision which will enhance youth service delivery and contact with young people across all sectors. We submitted a bid in order to purchase mobile computer and digital equipment that will be loaned out to voluntary organisations for use with young people during events and activities organised e.g. photography workshops, training sessions, focus groups, competitions etc.



**So remember, this is your opportunity for this unique service, it is offered for free for organisations working in the field of children and young people!**

On loan are: laptops, wi-fi printers (multi purpose) , one PC projector, video cameras and digital cameras.

Urdd Gobaith Cymru is pleased to announce that it is one of two national partner in Wales who will be supplying O2 Think Big project for youth between 12-25 in Wales.

Urdd Gobaith Cymru will have almost £ 80,000 to be distributed directly to young people to realize small community projects. Grants of £300 each but some can benefit from the O2 Think Bigger plan which is worth £2,500 each.

Over the next two years Urdd Gobaith Cymru and O2 Think Big will be aiming to work on 150 community projects.

Dyfrig Morgan, Director of Urdd Gobaith Cymru Youth, said:

*"Young people have good ideas. They're full of energy and enthusiasm but need support to turn ideas into reality. Through O2 Think Big scheme we are able to offer training, support and money. The scheme believes that young people can make a difference within their communities and for assisting young people to maximize their potential*



*and to inspire others. The Urdd is delighted to be part of this scheme which provides support and confidence for young people to work directly for the benefit of their communities. "*

Young people will be able to apply for grants through collaboration with the Urdd youth staff network throughout Wales, the Youth Pathways Officers and Urdd Gobaith Cymru Development Officers. When

projects are authorized groups will receive a grant of up to £300, a mobile phone with £30 of credit, access to O2's online training and support and an opportunity to apply for O2 Think Bigger funds worth £2,500 and an opportunity to move their ideas forward to a higher level.

TWF has been on a visit to Bangor Carnival with their touring trailer with brand new magazine to share with parents of small babies.



TWF will encourage and offer support to parents to speak Welsh at home with their babies from the start. A new magazine called "TWF And You" has been published in order to answer parents' questions on how to introduce Welsh at home. It is full of colorful pictures and advice from parents, midwives, together with global experts on bilingualism, Professor Colin Baker of the University of Bangor, and has generated a good response from parents.

Parents who received a copy of the magazine were Anne and Gerallt Jones, parents of Frances, age 5, and Thomas is 15 months old. The stories in the magazine are very relevant to their situation as a family as they made the decision to introduce Welsh to the children at a young age.

"Gerallt speaks Welsh with the children all the time and I speak mainly English" said Ann. "Grandparents speak Welsh with them too, and I'm learning a few words.

Ffion comes home from school and patters in Welsh and she explains to me what the words mean. We also chose to send them to a Welsh medium nursery as they have a good foundation before starting school." The TWF trailer will be touring many carnivals and shows throughout Wales, offering a comfortable place to feed and change the baby, and where the parents relax, and of course offer advice on speaking Welsh to babies.
