Convergence Programme for West Wales and the Valleys 2007-2013

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What can voluntary and community organisations do locally to prepare for the new programmes?

Organisations that would like to get involved in the Convergence Programmes, and see the proposed priorities as being relevant to their areas of work, are encouraged to undertake independent evaluations of current activities in terms of outcomes and impact against national strategies, links with statutory initiatives e.g. Job Centre Plus, New Deal; links with other voluntary/public sector partners and synergies with other Objective One projects.

Groups should also start talking to potential partners about project ideas and should seek to build on and extend existing successful partnerships, so that ideas can be

worked up as soon as the new programmes come on stream in late spring 2007.

In early 2007 WEFO will introduce a facility on their website for organisations to register their interest with project ideas and provide a short description of the proposed activity; this will allow WEFO to start to join up project activity. The contact details for the Strategic Framework co-ordinators should also appear on the website and groups are encouraged to contact the co-ordinators at an early stage to discuss project ideas.

Organisations are also encouraged to contact their local County Voluntary Councils

(CVCs) and/or WCVA to make them aware of project ideas, so that links can be made with other relevant local projects and information can be fed into the relevant partnerships. Organisations looking to develop larger scale projects, operating across one or more Spatial Plan area should contact WCVA.

A note from the Chief Officer...

Happy new year to all our readers - although a large chunk of the year has already passed, this is the first edition of Mantell in 2007 and it seems appropriate to wish all your various groups and organisations well in 2007.

We had some exceptionally good news at Mantell before Christmas. Our application for increased funding to support the Gwynedd Volunteering Bureau had been successful. As many of you are aware our core funding comes from the Welsh Assembly Government via the WCVA. Mantell has, for many years, put forward strong arguments for maintaining the current level of service in the south of Gwynedd. A vast geographical county, dispersed population and the need to maintain a fully bilingual service were all put forward in our claim for increased funding. Thankfully we were successful and so the valuable service of the Volunteer Bureau will remain for the foreseeable future. We are immensely grateful to Alun Ffred AM and Elfyn Llwyd MP for their support.

In addition to this we had more good news for the Volunteer Bureau as we were awarded funding as a result of the Russell Commission - this was set up to improve the infrastructure of volunteering amongst young people. We approached the 14-19 Learning Network to match this Russell Commission fund and they agreed. This has now enabled us to employ an additional officer within the bureau to work exclusively with young people. The Youth Volunteering Officer post has been advertised and I very much hope that by the next edition of Mantell we will be welcoming a new member of staff on board. All of these developments within the Volunteer Bureau are a clear indica-

tor that greater importance is being placed on the young people agenda in connection with volunteering.

On a strategic note, those of you who have been watching developments in connection with Spatial Planning will be aware that this is the Assembly vision for the development of Wales in the next twenty years and outlines the agenda necessary to accommodate investment that will ensure a sustainable future for the communities of Wales. I have represented the Voluntary Sector (North West region), on the Officer Group from the outset and will be reporting in future issues of Mantell. I am also pleased to report that Mantell, on behalf of the Sector, drew the attention of Minister Sue Essex to the Gwynedd Mapping Work thus ensuring that the Sector is included in any future planning. As a result an additional piece of work has been commissioned with specific emphasis on the Sector's involvement in future planning.

I hope you enjoy this edition of Mantell and that, as usual, you find information which is of use to your various organisations.

registered with these GP's you can request an appointment by telephoning the North Wales Breast Screening Centre in Llandudno, Monday to Friday 9.00am - 5.00pm on **01492 860888**.

Please help Breast Test Wales by keeping to the correct time and date for your appointment or telephoning the Centre in Llandudno to change or cancel your appointment.

Two highly trained female radiographers explain the procedure to each woman. The breast is held firmly in place by two plastic plates whilst the x-ray is taken. Most women describe the test as uncomfortable a small minority say it is painful. The breast x-ray, a mammogram, only takes a few moments.

Breast Test Wales provides a high quality breast screening service, Heather Ramessur, Screening Promotion Officer comments "Breast Screening can detect tiny cancers before any symptoms can be seen or felt and by detecting the cancer early this can mean greater treatment choice and better outcome". Breast Test Wales is now contributing to a 19% reduction in the death rates for Breast cancer in Wales in the age group invited for screening.

from which a winner for Wales will be chosen.

For a village to be considered for the overall title of Calor Village of the Year® for Wales 2007, it will need to enter all four categories.

All you need to start is to form a committee in your Neighbourhood. It doesn't need to be a formal committee just a few friends or like minded neighbours! Identify an area that you feel will benefit from being improved to make a cleaner and greener place for you to live. Increase your pride in your area. Wales in Bloom Judges will visit your entry during the month of August and they will give you advice on your entry and make suggestions on how to move forward and develop your entry.

You will receive a written report and a certificate which will show your achievement. Awards received are Improvement, Merit or Outstanding depending on Judging points. The certificates will be awarded at our Annual Awards Ceremony on 28th September at Caerphilly Castle.

Mainstreaming SD Policies in the Gwynedd Voluntary Sector

Following a successful pilot in 2006, Sustainable Wales is being funded by Countryside Council for Wales to provide a second round of training in 2007.

SW are offering a limited number of free training days across Wales to help introduce and implement workplace policies that support sustainable development (SD), environmental and ethical good practice.

A full training day will be dedicated to Gwynedd voluntary groups through Mantell Gwynedd at the end of March. We will provide training to Mantell Gwynedd themselves as well as to registered local groups. By working this way, we hope to create a county network of local support.

Heritage Lottery Fund Places of Worship in Wales

Is your place of worship listed and being used for public worship more than 6 times a year?

Do you provide public access outside the usual hours of worship?

Have you identified a high level of structural problems with the historic parts of the building in a recent survey?

If you are a formally constituted religious organisation and owner of the place of worship, you can apply for

a maximum of £100,000 but will need to achieve at least 10% partnership funding. HLF receives applications in two batches, with closing dates for these at the end of March and September in addition to a 6 month assessment period.

Age Concern
