A note from the Chief Officer

Continuity & Change – Refreshing the Relationship between Welsh Government and the Third Sector.

This consultation was launched by Welsh Government on 16th of May last year by the then Minister with responsibility for the Third Sector, Huw Lewis. To those of you who regularly read this column in the newsletter you will recall my request last year for individuals and organisations in Gwynedd to respond to this important consultation which was open until August 8th.

On November 13th last year the new Minister for Communities and Tackling Poverty, Jeff Cuthbert, made an announcement in the Senedd which stated that the current £7.3m Infrastructure funding would remain in the Draft Budget for 2014/15. Personally I welcomed the news that 10% of overall funding would not be used to set up an Innovation Fund as had been originally suggested. The Minister also made it clear that the proposed funding was based on the need to demonstrate robust Regional working, something we already practise widely amongst CVCs in North Wales. He emphasised the critically important relationship of the Third Sector with Local Authorities and other public bodies in Wales and the need to strengthen Local Compacts. The Ministers' full statement can be seen on Welsh Government website. On the whole, the Ministers' statement has been welcomed by the Third Sector. He has, very clearly, taken note of local consultation responses.

Many of the consultation responses were from Gwynedd and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all individuals and organisations who took the time to respond. We will be working with Welsh Government and politicians over the next few months to work out a funding formula which will operate beyond 2014/15. For us in Gwynedd it is vital that any funding formula takes account of the vast geographical area we serve, hard to reach pockets of population and the need for a fully bilingual service across the county. On a personal note I would like to extend my thanks to Assembly Member Dafydd Elis-Thomas who, time and time again, has taken the opportunity to support the Third Sector and emphasise these unique requirements in a county like Gwynedd. Hopefully continued political pressure will ensure that we reach agreement on an equitable funding formula for post 2015.

Before closing my column this time I would like to mention the fact that Rhianon Jones, our Volunteer Co-ordinator, will be retiring at the end of this month. Rhianon has worked for almost 13 years in Mantell Gwynedd and she has seen many changes within the company and within the Third Sector during this time. The Gwynedd Volunteer Centre and Mantell Gwynedd will certainly miss Rhianon. She has been immensely supportive of myself ever since I came into post nine years ago and I am most grateful to her for her continued support. I hope she enjoys a well earned and healthy retirement. On behalf of all of the staff and members of the Management Board I wish Rhianon well. Carwyn Humphreys has been appointed as the new Volunteer Centre Co-ordinator and will commence the post on March 1st. He currently works as the Children and Young People Facilitator at Mantell Gwynedd. I also wish Carwyn well in his new post.

HAVE YOUR SAY ON COUNCIL PRIORITIES



Gwynedd Council is eager to hear the views of Third Sector organisations and groups on its draft priorities for 2014 - 15.

Last year, the Council published its Strategic Plan for 2013 - 17. The purpose of the Strategic Plan is to set the Council's vision and priorities for the coming years. However, some things have changed since then that

will have a major impact on the work, shape and priorities of the Council in the coming years.

Firstly, there will be less money available to maintain services which means that the Council must find new and different ways of providing services in the future. Secondly, the Sir Paul Williams Commission report on the future of local services in Wales suggests merging Gwynedd and Anglesey Councils. This will have implications for the shape of the Council and its services for the future.

The Council has therefore decided to review its Strategic Plan and invites the public and its partners to have their say on its draft priorities for 2014 - 15. The draft priorities have been published in a Consultation Document on the Council's website and on the Mantell Gwynedd website. Hard copies are available upon request and at the Council's Offices, Libraries and Leisure Centres. The deadline for responding to the consultation is 10 March 2014. As well as responding individually, Third Sector organisations and groups will have the opportunity to come together to discuss the draft priorities at a special meeting which is being organised by the Council and Mantell Gwynedd. Information about the meeting will be published on the Council's website and the Mantell Gwynedd website.

The Council and Mantell Gwynedd are hoping that Third Sector organisations and groups will take advantage of this opportunity to influence the Council's priorities and direction for the future.



Teulu Ni project Successes

The Project succeeded in reaching the standards set by Clywed (i.e. listening to the voice of the families) and therefore earned the right to display its logo on all the Project's activities.

Participation is very important to the Project and with the support of Cartref Bontnewydd we will be starting a Parents Group in order to ascertain what the families needs are, as well as ensuring that their voices are heard in the Project's activities. One parent has already joined the Steering Group and is also a member of Ecorys's Family Advisory Panel (the organisation responsible for monitoring all the Improving Futures programme).

At present, 33 families are receiving the services which includes 15 new families. The Project has



withdrawn support from 9 families as they have achieved the goals set.

With the support of the Project, a parent from Mynytho has passed her driving test. This will enable her to take her children to after school and weekend activities.


Goodbye and THANK YOU!

This is an excellent example of how determination and hard work can pay off. Director, John Thirsk, started off with this idea inspired by his passion for local history along with the need to do something for Caernarfon to attract more visitors. Other members of the community were drawn in to this idea and a group came together to form a Community Interest Company.

After a successful trial run, funds have been secured via Communities Investment Fund run by WCVa and ERDF supported, to pay for the train locomotive, carriages and essential equipment to offer tours through Caernarfon to promote the heritage of the town and increase its attractiveness to visitors. The train will be launched on the 12th April at the beginning of the Easter holidays. This Social Enterprise will invest all profits back into the community to offer facilities for young people to learn their heritage and also take part in Visual Arts workshops. This enterprise will also create employment and volunteering opportunities for the local people. The Enterprising Communities Development Officer has been meeting regularly to offer advice and support.

Welsh Government launch a £10 million capital fund to support projects to tackle poverty

Those applying for a grant will have to prove that their project will prevent and help to alleviate the effects of poverty.


