Volunteering celebration at Portmeirion

The annual Celebration and Thank you Event was held on the 6th June in Portmeirion, as part of national Volunteers' Week – an annual campaign to celebrate the contribution made by volunteers across the UK.

Bethan Russell Williams, Mantell Gwynedd's Chief Officer, opened the event with over 50 people in attendance at Hercules Hall, which boasts a stunning Jacobean ceiling, dark wood panelling features and mullioned windows. "We are delighted to be in Portmeirion this year to celebrate all your achievements", said Bethan in her opening statement, "All of you here today represent just a fraction of many of the fantastic volunteers who work hard to support their communities in Gwynedd".

We were joined by our guest speaker, Emyr Williams, Chief Executive of Eryri National Park Authority. He spoke of the important contributions made by volunteers who help within the national park. He added that since the pandemic, the number of people who have signed up to join the Caru Eryri campaign (clearing rubbish and maintaining the main footpaths of our mountain ranges), has been exceptional.

Over 20 awards were presented to volunteers and groups during the ceremony which included outstanding achievement awards for individuals, groups and trustees. Ending the ceremony was the Chief Officer's special recognition certificate awarded to Snowdonia Donkeys for their remarkable work since their inception a decade ago.
