

# Planning FOR RE



During the last few months, the Talysarn and Nantlle Community First Partnership have been planning to hold this type of activity, and over the coming months a consultation will be carried out.

Work on the project started back in March when a number of the partnership members attended a course on how to conduct a consultation using the 'Planning for Real' method. Three sub groups were formed to organise and plan the work. They have been meeting on a regular basis and feeding back to a Steering Group. The first step involved building a 1:500 scale model of the consultation area, i.e. the villages of Talysarn and Nantlle. This was done by children from the local junior schools. There was also a need to translate some of the material received from 'Planning for Real' in prepara-

tion for the consultation.

The next step involved the inhabitants of Talysarn and Nantlle. The model was erected and set up in a central location where the villagers had the opportunity to state their views and make suggestions as to what improvements they would like to see in their community. They did this by using the small suggestion cards received and placing them on the model.

At the end of the consultation meeting, the cards will be sorted under different headings ready for the next step. This involves a number of the people who attended the consultation meetings being invited back to prioritise the suggestions and recommendations made.

The next stage, following the consultation period and the process of prioritising the

information gained, an Action Plan will be created for the area. This will set out the aspirations of the wider community, identifying the issues of concern and prioritising any actions the community wishes to take forward to address these problems.

Therefore if you live in either Talysarn or Nantlle, be prepared to take part. An open meeting will be held in your area in the coming months and if you want to influence any development this is your opportunity.

A leaflet will be distributed around the villages informing you of when and where the consultation will take place - watch out for these.

Strategic documents such as the 'Social Enterprise Strategy 2005, 'Wales: A Better Country', 'Wales: A Vibrant Economy' and 'Making The Connections' - all recognise the role and value of the Third Sector in Wales. This is positive news for us all working within the sector in Wales.

Once again, we are approaching Annual General Meeting time at Mantell. This year we will be meeting at the foot of the Rivals in the wonderful Nant Gwrtheyrn. I extend a warm welcome to you to join us at Nant Gwrtheyrn. It is a magical location, steeped in history and I can only hope that the spirit of Gwrtheyrn will be looking over us for a worthwhile meeting. I look forward to seeing you.



### **Meeting Of The Voluntary Sector Partnership Council**

The Voluntary Sector Partnership Council, which is established under the Assembly's Voluntary Sector Scheme, met on Monday 12 June to discuss issues affecting the sector in Wales.

At the meeting, the Minister for Social Justice and Regeneration, Edwina Hart, informed the sector that the new Disadvantaged Groups Development Fund will be delayed and will be consulted upon over the summer.

It was agreed at the meeting that the Assembly will work closely with the sector in developing arrangements to consult on the Child Poverty implementation plan. An 'open door' policy will operate for this consultation and the Assembly will work closely with the End Child Poverty Network Cymru, WCVA and others to reach as many interested groups as possible.

A similar partnership approach was agreed for work around the Treasury review of the third sector, following representations from WCVA that this review could offer benefits and opportunities for Wales.

Other notable decisions included an agreement from the Minister to look into taking forward work on accessible meetings. The Minister will also hold discussions with the Deputy Minister, Huw Lewis, on the voluntary sector's role in implementing the Indebtedness in Wales action plan.

The Welsh Assembly Government made a commitment, as part of its election manifesto for the 2003 Assembly elections, to create a Commissioner of Older People in Wales with the intention of appointing a first ever Commissioner for Older People in Wales during 2007.

The Commissioner will be an independent office holder and will work to ensure that the interests of older people in Wales are safeguarded and promoted. The Commissioner will be able to act as a source of information, advocacy and support for older people and will encourage best practice in their treatment.

Importantly, the Commissioner will also ensure that older people themselves

can influence the way in which important public services are managed and delivered in Wales.

### Social Risk Fund - WCVA

# WELSH CHURCH FUND Support for Registered Charities in Gwynedd

The purpose of the Fund is to promote the activities of charitable organisations benefiting the residents of Gwynedd and enriching the area's communities.

Local eisteddfodau who have registered as a charity are entitled to receive a sum of £250 annually towards the costs of any eisteddfod held within the County.

Another £19,000, or thereabout, is available for distribution to other charities in Gwynedd annually through the Welsh Church Fund, and individual

grants tend to be in the region of £100 up to a maximum of £3000 in exceptional circumstances.

The next quarterly meeting will be held on 19th December, 2006 and applications must be received at least four weeks beforehand, i.e. 21st November, 2006.
